Take home sheet Digging deeper into the true stories about King Saul

A pick and mix of ideas that you can use as a family to explore what your child is learning about King Saul, on Sunday mornings in November.



Hide & Seek Baking! Bake some <u>fairy cakes</u> or <u>bread rolls</u> (BBC good food has child friendly recipes) and hide a raisin in one of the cakes/rolls. The person who finds the raisin is the king (or queen!) for the day. While you enjoy your cakes together, explore the following questions: *When Samuel*

wanted to anoint Saul as king, he was hiding. Why do you think Saul didn't want to be king? Why didn't he think he was the right man for the job?

Go fetch! Game: For the purpose of this game, one person will be king and everyone else is a servant. The servants have 15 seconds to find an item that meets the king's search criteria. If a servant can't bring the item within 15 seconds, they're out. Items can be reused if they fit the new criteria. The last one still

in the game wins and becomes king for the next round. Some ideas to get you started:

- Something of a certain colour
- Something of a certain shape
- Something that you can use for a certain purpose

Why is it important to be faithful in the small things that God asks you to do?



Table talk:

- What is God looking for more than outward forms of worship to Him?
- What does wholehearted obedience look like? How is this different from the way that Saul obeyed God at times?

Family challenge: Play a game of rounders, football, basketball or a concentration card game like Dobble or Snap. What do you need to focus on during these games? What happens when you take your eyes off the ball or the cards? In the same way, we need to keep our eyes on Jesus, not the distractions of this world.
